English: The hazel is dropping wisdom nuts again.

Irish: Tá bláth bán ar an sceach gheal.

Pronunciation: taw blah BAWN er un shkakh yal

English: White blossom dresses the hawthorn.

Irish: Cuimhin leis an dair gach mionn.

Pronunciation: KWIV-in lesh un darr goh myun

English: The oak remembers every oath.

Irish: Lig dúinn foscadh a ghlacadh faoi chlaí an chuileann.

Pronunciation: lig DOO-in FOS-kah a GHLAK-uh fwee khlee un KHWI-len

English: Let's shelter under the holly hedge.

Irish: Insíonn an iúr scéalta uaigheanna.

Pronunciation: in-SHEE-un un yoor SHKAYL-tuh OO-ih-en-uh

Pronunciation: mil-i-SHEEN FEE-uh OO-la gwee on OAR
